



What will your child's secondary school experience look like with Full Subject-Based Banding



Learn for Life - Remaking Education Pathways



One Secondary School Education, Many Subject Bands.

For 2025 Sec 1, students can take a combination of G1/G2/G3 subjects based on their PSLE scores, suited to their pace of learning. Thereafter, their subject levels will be based on their strengths and interests.

One Common Certificate

Students will sit for the common national examination and receive a new national certificate that reflects their G1/G2/G3 subjects. In 2028, MOE will implement a new post-secondary admission system.



Increased access to polytechnics as students taking G3 subjects or a mix of G3 and G2 subjects will be eligible to apply for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme by 2028.

Lifetime Cohort Participation Rate for publiclyfunded university degrees will increase to 60% in 2025, up from 50% today.

Offering Subjects at a More Demanding Level – students taking mainly G1 & G2 subjects (at start of Sec 1)

At the start of Secondary One, all students can offer **English Language**, **Mother Tongue Languages**, **Mathematics and Science** at a more demanding level based on their PSLE Achievement Level (AL) for each subject.



Offering Subjects at a More Demanding Level – students taking mainly G1 & G2 subjects (beyond start of Sec 1)

Beyond the point of admission, students who have met academic requirements and have done well, i.e. obtained 75% or more at school-based assessments can calibrate their curricular load by offering subjects at a more demanding level.

Expanded Opportunities for Humanities Education

- Students taking predominantly G2 subjects can take G3 Humanities subjects, e.g. Geography, History or Literature based on interest and aptitude
