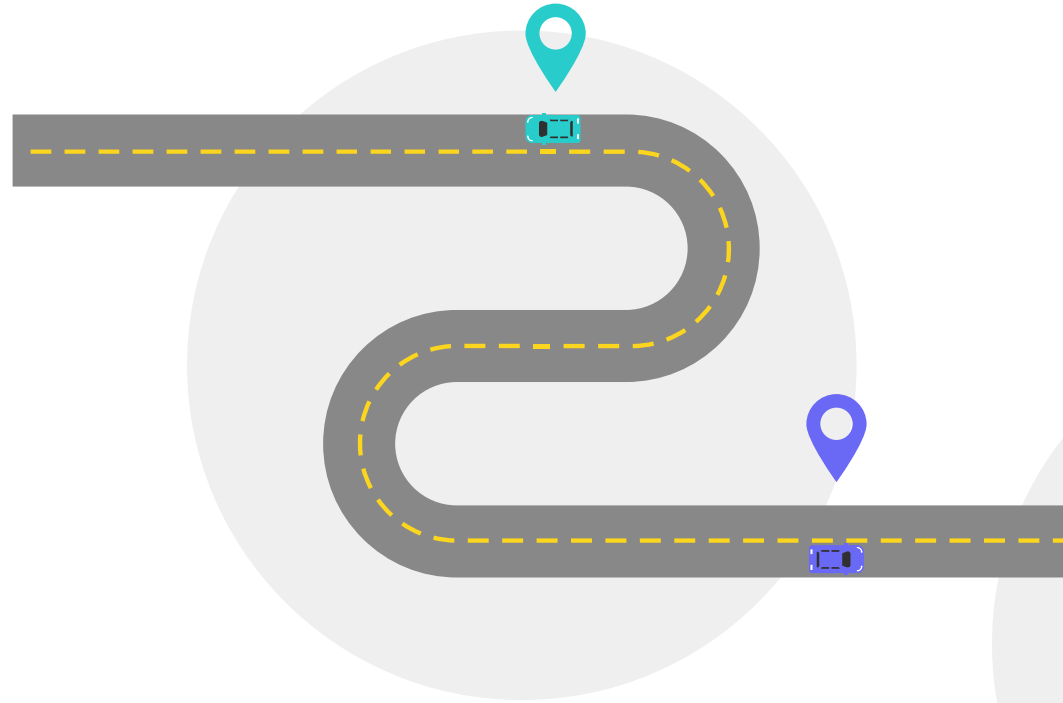



Promotion Criteria to Sec 3

Promotion Criteria to Sec 3 Express

1. Pass in English (C6 or better) and an overall percentage pass (50%) in the average of all subjects.
2. Failure to do so, student will be laterally transferred to Sec 3 Normal (A) in 2025. There is no retention at Secondary 2 Express.

Secondary 2 Normal (A) to 3 Normal (A)

Criterion: Pass in English (Grade 5 or better) and TWO other subjects


OR

Pass (Grade 5 or better) in FOUR subjects

Failure to do so, student will be retained at Sec 2 Normal (A) in 2025.

Secondary 2 Normal (A) to 3 Express

Criterion: Students who have achieved an average of 70 % or higher in overall results may be laterally transferred to the Sec 3 Express stream



Secondary 2 Normal Technical (NT) to 3 Normal Technical (NT)

Criterion: Pass 2 subjects (Grade D or better) including English or Mathematics

Secondary 2 Normal Technical (NT) to 2 Normal Academic (NA)

Criterion: Students who have achieved an average of 70 % or higher in overall results may be laterally transferred to the Normal (Academic) Stream at the same level (i.e. Sec 2T to Sec 2N)

Student needs to demonstrate mastery by obtaining a minimum overall percentage score of 55% in the subject(s) at Sec 2.

- Students with MT exemption would need to offer Option A in order to take 5 examinable subjects

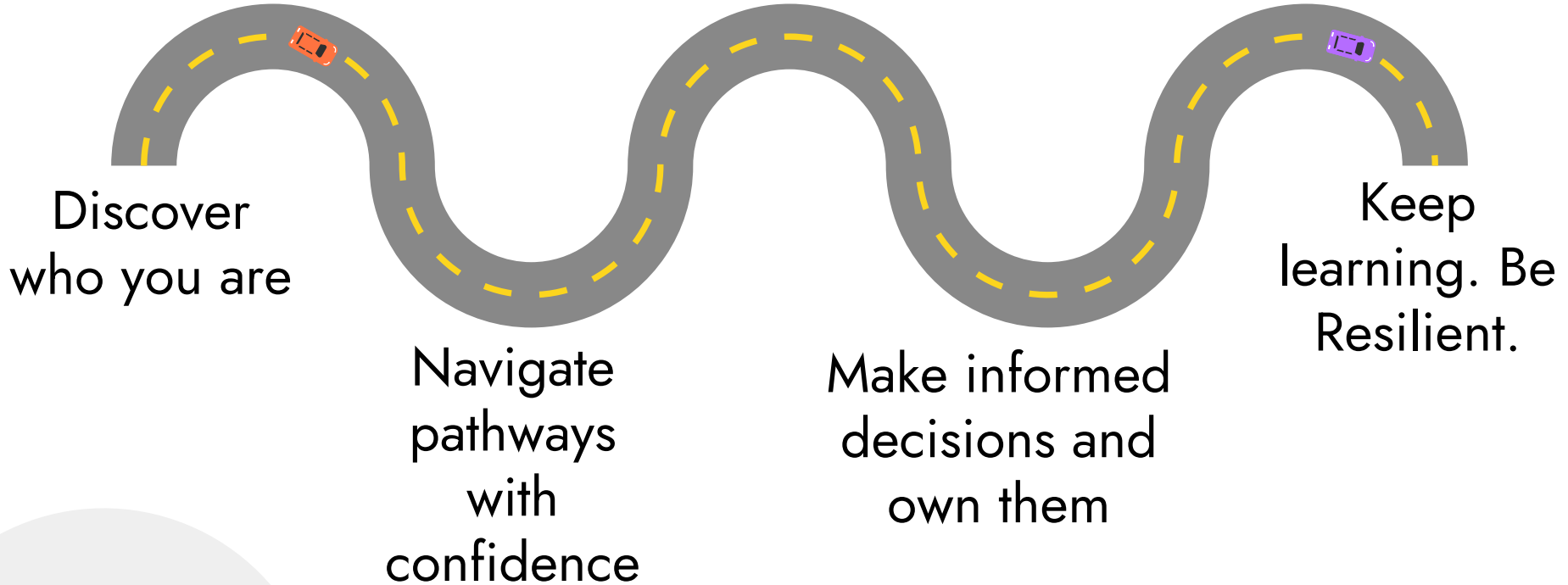
DO TAKE NOTE...

No changes should be made to these final choices unless a significant learning need is identified.

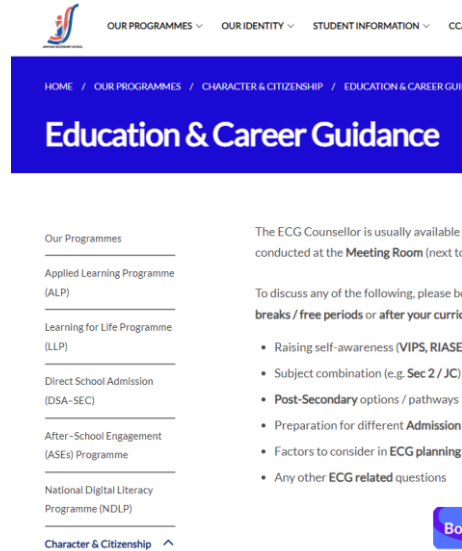
