
Looking back, OCT Iqbal is happy with his decision, and has found many parallels between rugby and the Army, such as the importance of teamwork and winning the support of your peers.



- All information on CCAs will be uploaded onto the school website on a termly basis
- Consent forms via Parent's Gateway will be issued only for the following reasons
 - i. Camps
 - Adventure or water-based activities
 - iii. Payment involved (Withdrawal from Edusave)
 - iv. Ad-hoc weekend/holiday activities for the CCA

Important dates to remember

- 10 to 14 Jan 2022 Knowing the CCAs (Self) (Completed)
- 21 Jan 2022 Selecting Trials / Selection sessions during CCE (Completed)
- 25 Jan to 15 Feb 2022 CCA Engagement and Trials (during CCA days)
- 21 Feb 2022 Final date of submission for CCA choices
- 10 Mar 2022 Release of CCA Allocation to Sec. 1s
- 29 Mar 2022 Start of CCA for Sec. 1 students

Considerations when choosing CCA.

- Considers child's strength / interest / experience /suitability
- All 5 options must be filled in
- All 5 options <u>must</u> be filled with a <u>different CCA</u> as option
- Do not waste the options
- Consider choices wisely

CCA Option Form (by 21 Feb)

- 5 options in CCA option form
- 1 of the choices stated <u>HAVE</u> to be from Uniform Group (UG)
- UGs have the capacity to take in more students
- Other CCAs are more limited due to safety considerations, number of instructors and venues

CCA Allocation

- CCA will be allocated according to order of choice subjected to:
 - Availability of CCA
 - Student has cleared selection/trial
- Student will definitely be allocated one of the five choices
- No transfer of CCA once CCA allocation is confirmed

Usage of bonus points

At the end of graduating year, the student's co-curricular attainment will be recognised and translated to bonus point(s) which can be used for admission to Junior College / Polytechnics / Institues of Technical Education (JC/Poly/ITE)

Usage of bonus points

- It can only be used when the minimum requirement is met for the course which the applicant is applying for
- This translate to a higher chance of getting into the course

- My child is involved in training with a National Sports Association (NSA) outside of school. Can he not have a CCA in school?
- Your child can be excused from taking a CCA in the school, with the Principal's approval. In addition, the training with the NSA must be on a regular basis and your child must be actively participating in training with the NSA.

- My child is good in XXX but your school does not offer, what can I do?
- Your child has to take part in CCA in our school but the school will support him in taking part in competition during National Schools games (Individual)

- Will CCA take up too much time from studies?
- CCA is a <u>key pillar</u> of <u>holistic education</u> in all secondary schools. Every CCA will have their peak and off peak periods. Therefore, do rest assured that your child will have time for their studies.

- Can my child choose Sports/Performing Arts if he/she does not have any experience?
- Yes. But the child will have to go through the trials/selections for the CCA. Through the trials and selections, your child will know if he will be selected. But do advise your child to keep an open mind.

- Can I appeal if my child did not get his/her first choice?
- We strongly recommend to discuss with your child his/her CCA selections and also find out from your child the CCA trials/selection results. This is to ensure that your child and you can make informed choices based on the results.
